Currently, I work as Assistant Professor at undergraduate and post-graduate courses at the Institute of Economics in the University of Campinas (Unicamp), where since 2014 I have been teaching Statistics, Time Series Analysis, Econometric Analysis of Panel Data, Applied Econometric Time Series and Mathematical Economics. I am the lead of a research group in Applied Social Economics made up of researchers from the Institute of Economics and from other Brazilian institutions, and currently I am director of Center for Social, Urban and I have significant experience in Social Economics, with emphasis on Economics of Crime and Health Economics.
